MISS COPLON FACES TRIAL IN NEW YORK

Clark Denies He Had Quarrel With FBI Chief Hoover

WASHINGTON, July 2.—(AP)—Judith Coplon, already under one sentence as a spy for Russia, now must wait the start of a second espionage trial.

She still denies protesting her innocence despite a jury's verdict and a judge's opinion to the contrary. The 29-year-old brunette returned to her native New York last night. She planned to spend the time until her next trial at her mother's home in Brooklyn.

"I hope I can get a fair trial there, especially as I will be out of the whole atmosphere of this loyalty-catch ridden town," she said in her farewell courtroom speech here.

No Quarrel With Hoover With the trial finally over, Attorney General Clark issued a statement saying he had no "quarrel" and "quarrel" with FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover and that there has been no "resignation" by Hoover.

Rumors to that effect grew out of introducing in evidence at trial, at defense insistence, 30 confidential FBI reports relating to internal security matters and to suspected espionage agents. Mr. Clark said this resulted "in some clamor for an investigation of the FBI."

"Intemperate and ill-adjudged charges were unjustly leveled at this branch of the Department of Justice," Mr. Clark said. "I heartily concur with the President that such an inquiry is not justified or necessary. I have complete confidence in J. Edgar Hoover."

Mr. Clark said both he and Mr. Hoover "realized the importance of maintaining the department's long established policy of protecting FBI reports," but that he chose to let the 20 reports go in rather than abandon the prosecution.

Goetsch To Be Expected "That hearsay and gossip should appear in the investigative reports is to be expected," Mr. Clark commented. "It is the way that complaints and information accumulate and it is sometimes necessary to clear up the facts and to lead to the development of a case."

Miss Coplon, a convicted Justice Department analyst, was convicted on a two-count indictment of stealing secrets from Justice Department files, intending to turn them over to Dr. Gulbichev, a Russian engineer attached to the United Nations staff. They are jointly accused of espionage conspiracy in the New York indictment.

In sentencing Miss Coplon yesterday, Federal Judge Irving R. Kaufman said "I was my duty—and I struggled as I knew to—see that the defendant had a fair trial. I went so far, at the instance of her government, and opened the files of the government, and even invited the government's best interest in doing it. In the interest of her fair trial. HEAVY REVENUE SETBACK STICKS U. S. WITH 1.8 BILLION DEFICIT, TRIPLE PREDICTION BY TRUMAN

WASHINGTON, July 2.—(AP)—A big government revenue setback stuck President Truman today with a 1949 fiscal year budget deficit of \$1,811,440,047.88—three times greater than the \$600,000,000 deficit predicted.

Because of the huge size of the federal money figures President Truman was off only 3.5 per cent in overestimating government income by \$275,000,000 over the twelve-month period ended Thursday. Mr. Truman's estimates were made last January.

The President missed the spending figure only three-tenths of one per cent and it was enough to throw him off \$123,000,000. Actual expenditures ran that much less than he had counted, easing the effect of his revenue overestimate.

BULGARIAN PREMIER SUCCUMBS

LONDON, July 2.—(AP)—Georgi Mikhailovich Dimitroff, premier of Bulgaria and one of the foremost leaders in world communism, died today, Moscow radio announced. He was 67.

He had been a lifelong revolutionary, an exile, trusted agent of Soviet Prime Minister Joseph Stalin, a principal defendant in the German Reichstag fire trial in 1933, and probably the most important Communist outside Russia.

The announcement distributed by the Soviet monitor here said death was due to diabetes. Mr. Dimitroff had been under treatment in a hospital in London for several months. He was granted leave from the premiership in April to obtain the treatment. Vassil Kolarov, premier and foreign minister, has since taken over his job.

YOUTH CHARGED WITH STRANGING CLASSMATE, DANA MARIE WEAVER; FINAL ARGUMENTS BEGIN

ROANOK, July 2.—(AP)—The state today asked a jury to send Lee Scott to the electric chair for the strangulation of his high school classmate, Dana Marie Weaver. Assistant Prosecutor Beverly L. Fitzpatrick made the demand as final arguments in the trial began in Hastings Court.

Mr. Fitzpatrick said the hulky, 16-year-old high school wrestler choked Dana Marie to death to avenge her. This, he said, was an attempt by Scott to protect his poor reputation as a youth-leader after the girl spurned his immoral advances in the kitchen of Christ Episcopal Church the night of May 4.

Only two people know exactly what happened to Dana Marie Weaver. Mr. Fitzpatrick said the jury at the conclusion of his 90-minute address.

What is a punishment commensurate with this crime? The answer is death. "Let it be said that you did your duty here today, that you sent Lee Scott to the electric chair for the murder of Dana Marie Weaver."

HOT WEEKEND IS PREDICTED FOR COUNTRY

The heat was on in full blast over most of the nation today and little relief was expected over the long, hot week, New York City weather bureau said.

Ocean breezes gave the East and West coastal areas pleasant weather, while some cooling weather was reported close to the Great Lakes.

But other parts of the country sweltered in the early heat and humidity. The Central and Southern states are in the "hot" weather of the summer season yet.

Although temperatures were pleasant in the Northeastern states there was no sign of rain to break the long, hot week. New York City was promised no rain to end the 37-hour drought. No rain was predicted for New Jersey, which has had no substantial falls for 41 days. The drought has caused heavy damage to farm crops in the two states and in Southern New England.
