NOTICE.

Foreign Parcel Post—Customs Declarations.

OFFICE OF SECOND ASST. P. M. GEN.,
WASHINGTON, Sept. 11, 1913.

The attention of the Department has been called to the frequent failure of postmasters in this country to require the name and address of the sender to be placed on the customs declarations of parcel post packages mailed in the United States addressed for delivery in foreign countries and to the frequent omission from said customs declarations of the postmark of the mailing post office. As these items of information are essential to the proper conduct of the service, postmasters are directed to see that they are supplied invariably on the customs declarations of parcel post packages presented at their offices for mailing to foreign countries.

Inventory of Mail Equipment.

OFFICE OF FOURTH ASST. P. M. GEN.,
WASHINGTON, Sept. 12, 1913.

Relative to inventory of mail equipment to be taken as of 12 o'clock noon, September 20, 1913, postmasters dispatching foreign mails will include in the count all mail bags sent out from their offices to foreign ports which will be in transit on steamships at noon, September 20, 1913.

Such postmasters and other postal employees as make freight shipments of mail bags and pouches between this date and September 20, inclusive, will make an itemized statement showing the number of each of the various classes of equipment that is included in each shipment and attach to the memorandum copy of the bill of lading that is forwarded to the Department. Care must be exercised that no duplications of these accounts are included with the account of the equipment actually in their possession on the 20th of September.
