Parcel-Post Packages for Foreign Countries.

SECOND ASST. POSTMASTER GENERAL,
Washington, August 30, 1922.

The attention of postmasters is called to the tables on pages 18 to 23 of the August Postal Guide, giving information relative to certain requirements to be observed in connection with the acceptance of parcel-post packages for foreign countries. These tables should be posted at receiving or stamp windows or kept so as to be easy of reference in case of need by postmasters or postal employees.

According to reports received, it is learned that postmasters at United States exchange post offices return daily to the mailing post offices a large number of packages which are not fully prepaid in postage or which do not have affixed sufficient postage stamps to pay the transit charges that may be due. By this return a delay in dispatch is occasioned and this delay frequently leads to complaint from the senders of the unsatisfactory nature of the information given them at the time of mailing.

At the New York post office as many as 1,000 customs declarations are daily written out and tied to packages which have been received at that post office, the additional labor being necessary because the packages were dispatched from the mailing post offices without customs declarations attached or because the correct number or proper kind of declarations were not furnished.

In order to do away with the need for returning packages from, or for having to affix customs declarations at, United States exchange post offices, some of the interior mailing post offices have made provision to have all international parcel-post packages before dispatch inspected at some one point in the post office so as to make certain that no packages are dispatched until all the requirements governing their transmission abroad have been fully complied with. It is requested that consideration be given to a like practice in all post offices with a view to doing away with the extra work now entailed at New York and other United States exchange post offices in connection with the correcting of irregularities observed at the time parcel-post packages are received from other post offices for dispatch abroad.
