### FOREIGN FRAUD ORDER NOTICES

## INSTRUCTIONS OF ASSISTANT POSTMASTER GENERAL BUREAU OF POST OFFICE OPERATIONS

### REPORTING OF EQUIPMENT MAINTENANCE ALLOWANCE IN FEDERAL INCOME TAX RETURNS OF RURAL CARRIERS

Information has been received from the Commissioner of Internal Revenue that a number of rural carriers, in making Federal income tax returns, are claiming deductions for equipment maintenance expense, without listing as income the amount of equipment maintenance allowance received by them. The Commissioner of Internal Revenue advises that a rural carrier is entitled to a deduction on his Federal income tax return

for the expense incurred in the operation of his personally owned equipment while used in carrying the mail, but that the amount of the allowable deduction is only the excess of expense incurred over the equipment maintenance allowance received by him.

This information is furnished as an aid to rural carriers in the preparation of their Federal income tax returns.

## INSTRUCTIONS OF ASSISTANT POSTMASTER GENERAL BUREAU OF TRANSPORTATION

### AIR SERVICE—A. M. 2

Effective on or about September 30, 1951, air mail service will be inaugurated at Binghamton, N. Y., on route A. M. 2.

No official cachet for first-flight covers will be authorized for Binghamton. However, souvenir covers received by the postmaster at Binghamton will be dispatched to first flights, if practicable.

## INSTRUCTIONS OF ASSISTANT POSTMASTER GENERAL BUREAU OF FINANCE

### POSTAL SAVINGS Requisitioning Certificates

The stock of postal-savings certificates at many post offices greatly exceeds the needs of the office for a 6-month period and many postmasters, notwithstanding the ample stock of certificates on hand, are requisitioning an additional supply.

Postmasters hereafter will not requisition postal-savings certificate stock in any denomination until the stock on hand of the denomination or denominations ordered is less than a 6-month supply; and the amount ordered shall not exceed that required for a 6-month period. Those offices having the special series of certificates with the name of the office overprinted thereon will hereafter order general series certificates in those denominations where a 6-month supply of a denomination will be less than five books.

### 1951-52—MIGRATORY GAME BIRD SEASON POSTER—LOBBY DISPLAY AUTHORIZED

The Fish and Wildlife Service of the Department of the Interior will shortly furnish all postmasters with the annual poster showing the open seasons for migratory game birds. This poster should be displayed on the bulletin board or in some other suitable location in the public lobby as long as space is available without interfering with the display of material subsequently authorized, and in such manner as not to mar the walls or woodwork.

The foregoing instructions do not apply to post office lobbies located in Government-owned buildings not operated by the Post Office Department.

**INSTRUCTIONS OF ASSISTANT POSTMASTER GENERAL BUREAU OF FACILITIES**

**ALLOWANCES FOR COMMUNICATION EXPENDITURES**

Postmasters are authorized to expend for excess calls, tolls, TWX and telautographs which are in addition to those included in the monthly service rate, and for telegrams and special delivery stamps furnished all postal activities in their areas during the month of September 1951, a sum not to exceed that expended for like services as reported by the same activities during the month of September 1950.

All postmasters who have not already done so should submit immediately requests for allowances for anticipated excess calls, tolls, telegrams, etc., to the Bureau of Facilities, Division of Budget and Administrative Services, in accordance with the instructions contained in the POSTAL BULLETIN of August 9, 1951.
