INSTRUCTIONS OF ASSISTANT POSTMASTER GENERAL BUREAU OF FINANCE

RETURN RECEIPTS New Stock Form 3811-A

A new stock form, Form 3811-A, has been provided for use in processing complaints of failure to receive return receipts requested for domestic registered and numbered insured mail, and in obtaining return receipts for such mail requested subsequent to the time of mailing.

Form 3811-A is available for use at all post offices of the first class, and the Bureau of Facilities has made an initial distribution of the new form to approximately 100 of the larger post offices of the first class. In the event the initial distribution is not sufficient to meet the estimated needs of the post offices involved, requisitions for additional supplies of the form should be submitted to the Bureau of Facilities, Division of Equipment and Supplies. Other post offices of the first class having need for Form 3811-A should likewise make requisitions for supplies thereof upon the Bureau of Facilities.

Any requisitions for Form 3811-A should be submitted on Form 1580. It is important that initial requisitions for the form not include requests for any other form or item.

**POSTERS REGARDING FOREIGN ASSETS CONTROL REGULATIONS
Lobby Display Authorized**

Amendment to notice appearing in the POSTAL BULLETIN No. 19521, dated March 20, 1952

In regard to a notice appearing in POSTAL BULLETIN No. 19521, under date of March 20, 1952, relative to the above subject, this notice is amended to read as follows:

To All Postmasters of First- and Second-Class Offices in the United States and to All Postmasters in California, Washington, Oregon, and the Territory of Hawaii:

In the very near future you will be furnished with a poster issued by the United States Treasury Department relative to Foreign Assets Control Regulations.

Upon its receipt the poster should be displayed for an indefinite length of time in a prominent location in the public lobby, preferably near the window where applications are made for registration of mail, in such a manner as not to mar the walls or woodwork.

The foregoing instructions do not apply to post office lobbies located in Government-owned buildings not operated by the Post Office Department.

AMENDMENT TO THE POSTAL LAWS AND REGULATIONS

REPORT OF MISSENDING, DELAY, OR DAMAGE OF ORDINARY MAIL

INSERT No. 486.

ORDER No. 50990; DATED APRIL 18, 1952.

Amend § 44.8 *Report of Missending, Delay, or Damage of Ordinary Mail* to read as follows:

"Missending . . . or damage of ordinary mail, including air mail and special-delivery mail, while in transit, shall be reported to the general superintendent, . . . Postal Transportation Service, of the division in which the irregularity occurred, if known; otherwise, to the general superintendent, . . . Postal Transportation Service, of the division in which the mailing office is located. Before the Postal Transportation Service is requested to investigate and report upon delays to mail of any class, while in transit, the postmaster receiving the complaint should refer the case to the postmaster at the office of address or the office of mailing, depending upon where the complaint originated, with a view toward ascertaining the cause of delay. Complaints of missending, delay, or . . . damage of such mail in post offices shall be reported to the inspector in charge of the division in which the office is located. Reports shall be made by letter, and the envelope or wrapper submitted therewith, if possible."
